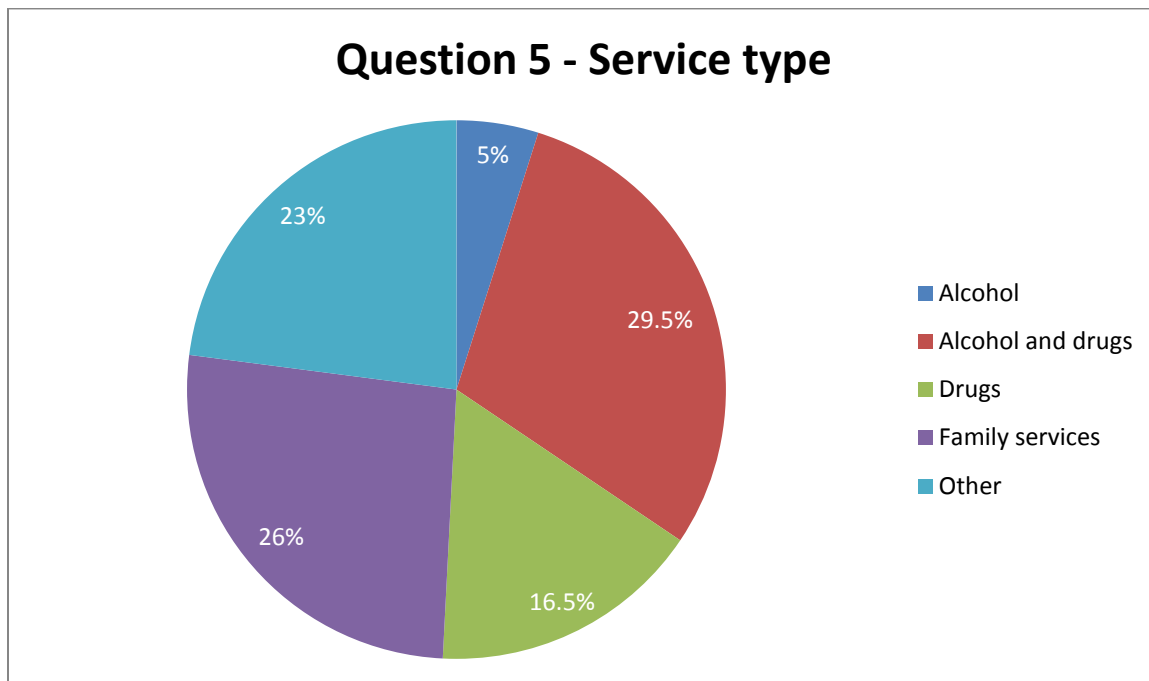
#### Adfam's workforce development questionnaire

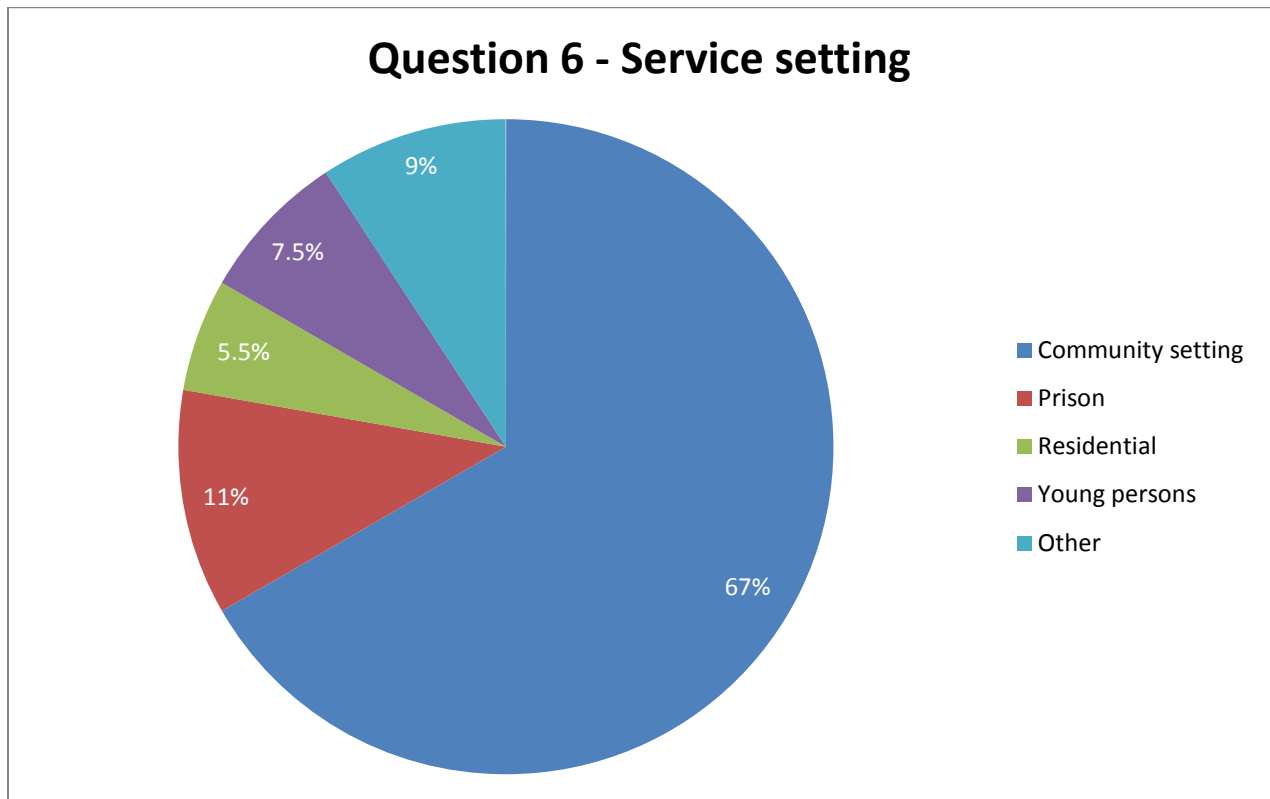
##### 2. Results

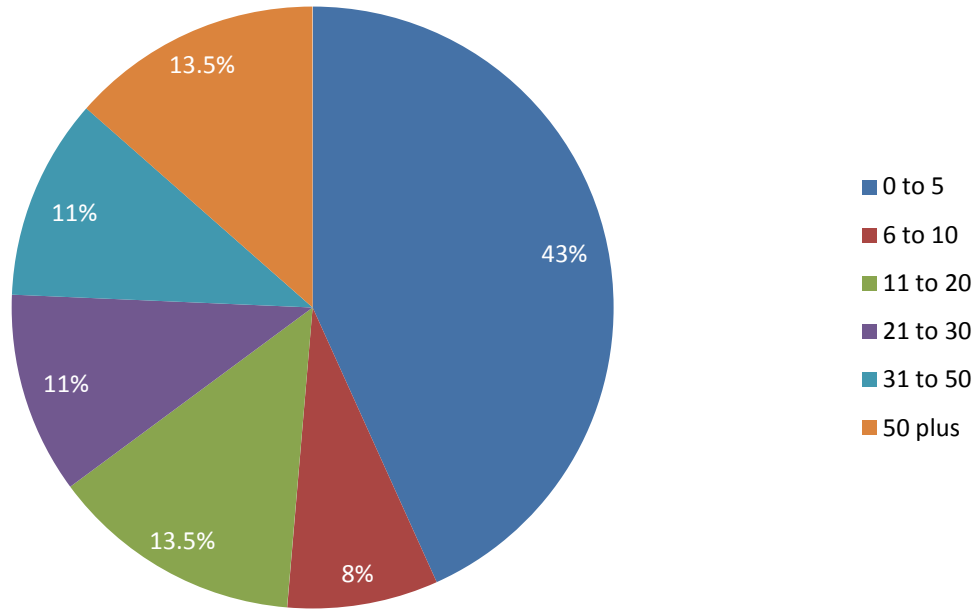

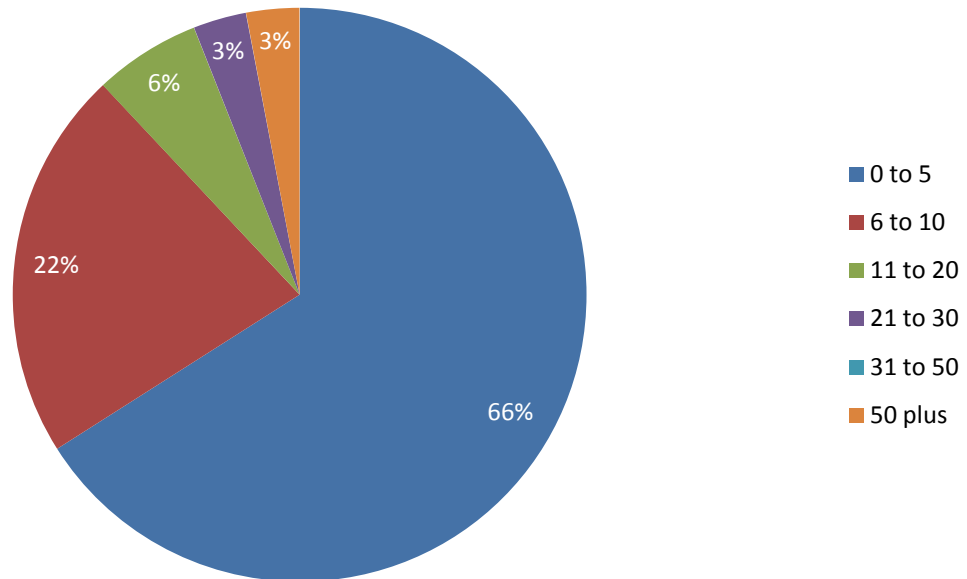

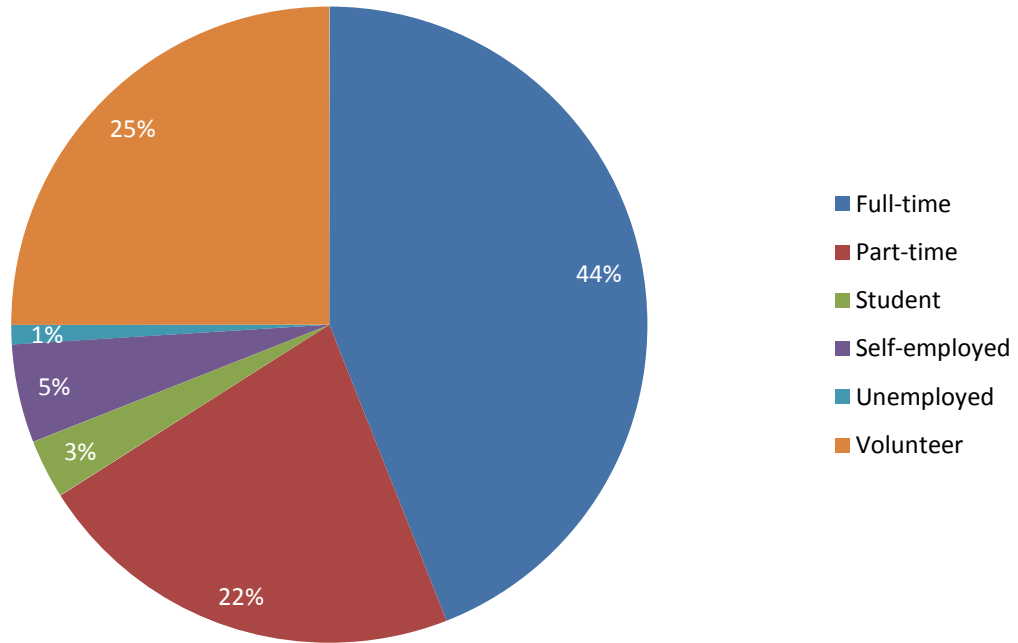
### Question 8a - How many people work in your service in total?



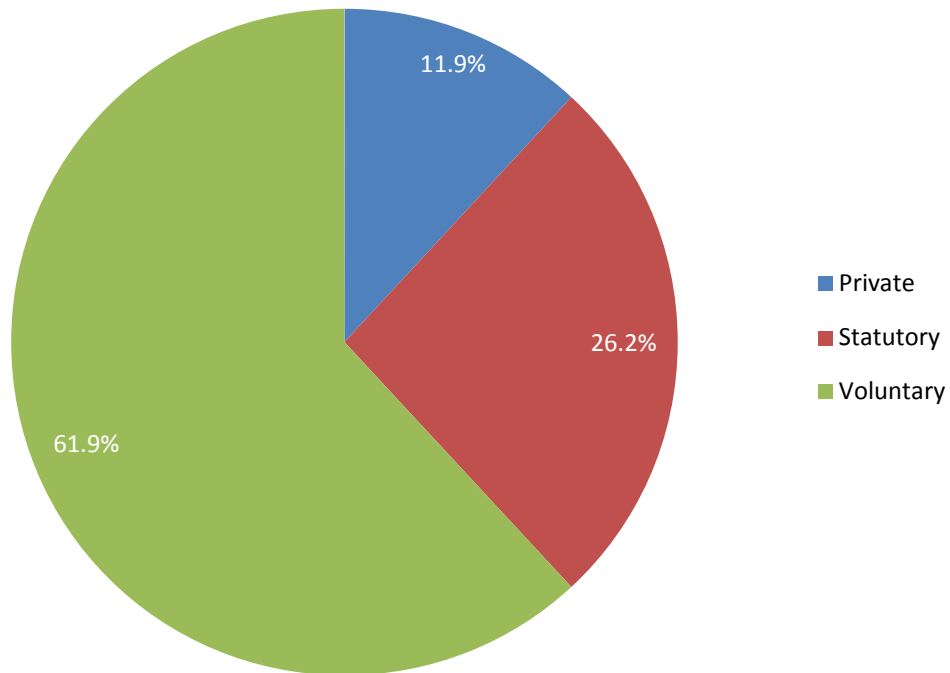
### Question 8b - How many people work in your service on family support?



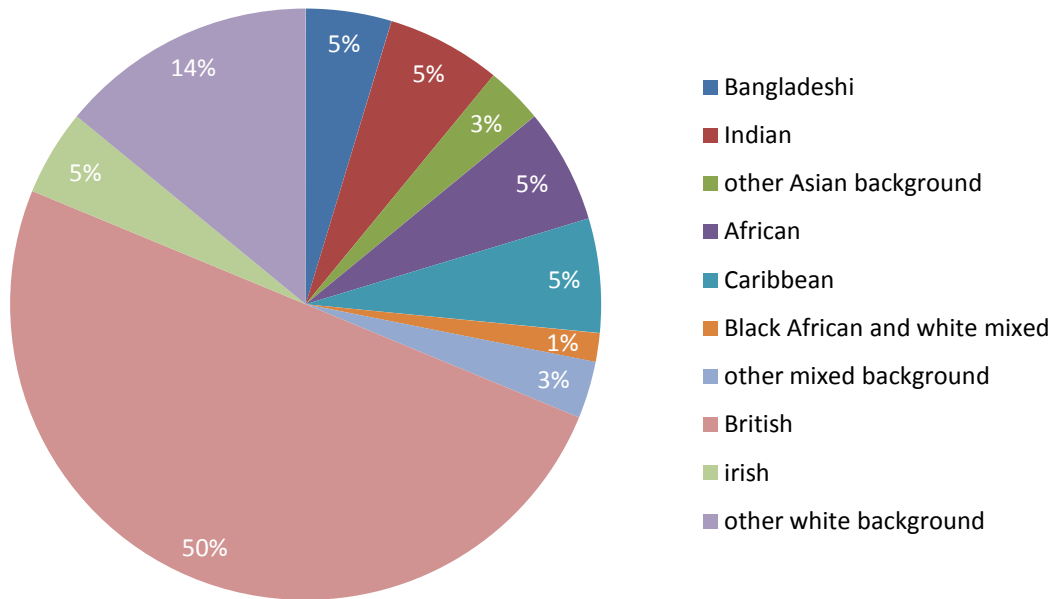
### Question 9 - What is the employment status of your family support staff?



### Question 10 - Which sector do you work in?

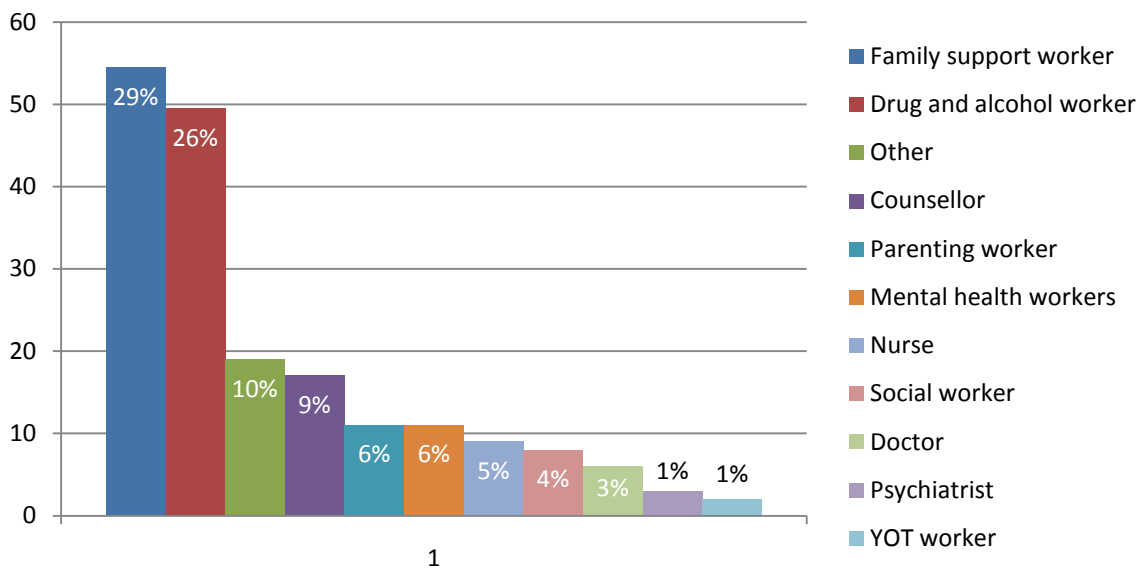


### Question 11 - What is the ethnicity of your family support staff?



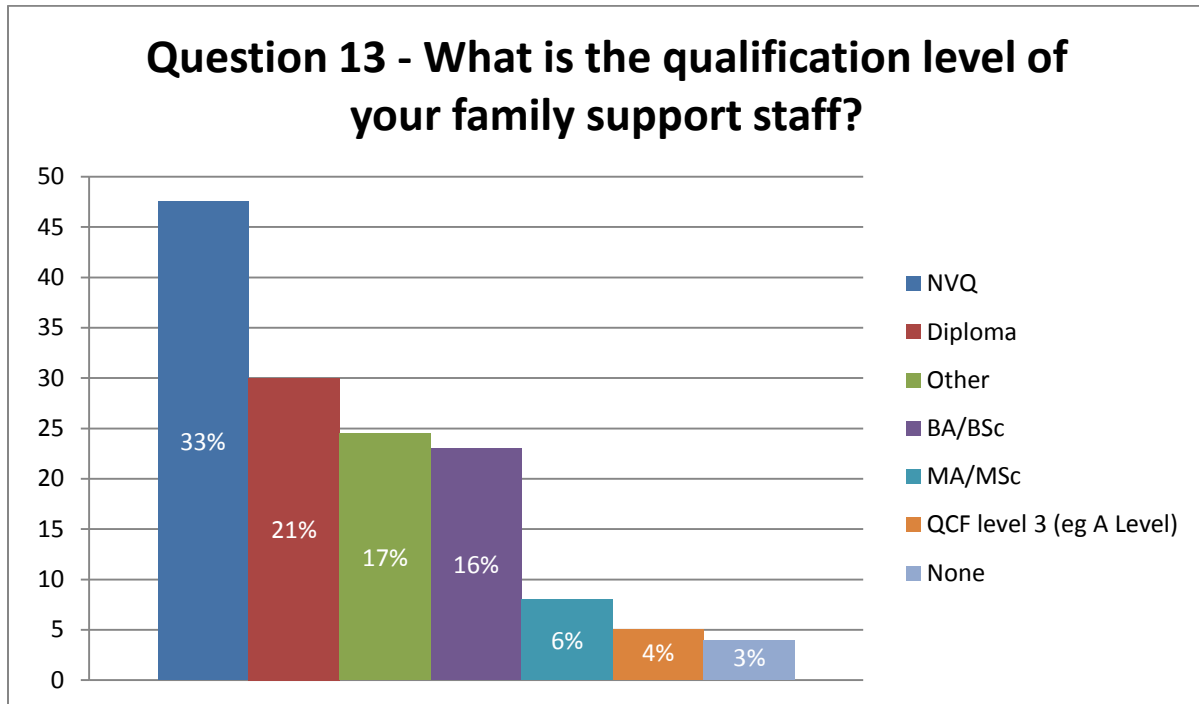
